The Foundation in partnership with Saint Thomas Church and other community organizations sponsored the 16th Annual East Columbus Gateway Thanksgiving Dinner on Sunday, November 19th at the William H. Adams Recreation Center in Columbus. Over 500 residents of the East Columbus neighborhood were served. The event addresses a great need in the community and has gained in popularity over the years, moving from the church basement to the Recreation Center's gym.

Carol Maddox, head of the organizing committee, says this is a thankful dinner, "An opportunity to bring everyone together, everyone who lives, works, plays and worships in the neighborhood".

The event is coordinated by the Community Outreach Ministry of Saint Thomas The Apostle Church who collaborates with other East Columbus organizations including Columbus Recreation & Parks Department, East Columbus Elementary School, the East Columbus Civic Association, Dominican Sisters of Peace, Corinthian Missionary Baptist Church, and other community groups.




Carol Maddox Honored at Bill Adams Memorial Service

The occasion was commemorated with a brief memorial service held before the East Columbus Community Thanksgiving Dinner on November 19th. Special guests attending the memorial included State Representative Hearcel Craig, and City Council Members Shannon Hardin and Jaiza Page. Craig, Hardin and Page shared their remembrances of Bill Adams and his service to the City of Columbus.

During the service Carol Maddox was presented with induction into the Foundation's "Circle of Village Elders". Village Elders are premier donors who help sustain the Foundation and others recognized for outstanding community service that is aligned with the Foundation's mission. The Village Elders concept is based on the African proverb, "It takes a whole village to raise a child".

Carol also received a Columbus City Council Resolution offered by Councilmembers Page and Hardin for her leadership in coordinating the annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner for over 15 years.

It wasn't just the rolls that tasted so good; it was that whole experience of going to Aunt Lucy's house to visit family and friends while enjoying the laughter, kind words, witty remarks and unconditional love.

Books were distributed to Foundation partners including the Adams Community Center and East Columbus Elementary School. Through the Foundation's efforts "Aunt Lucy's Rolls" is also in circulation with the Columbus Metropolitan Library.




