Mayor Coleman named Foundation Village Elder

Mayor Micheal B. Coleman was inducted into the Circle of Village Elders in honor of his outstanding record of public service. Coleman was the 52nd mayor of Columbus and the first African-American to serve as mayor of Ohio's capital. As he began his 15th year in office in 2014, Coleman achieved the distinction of being the longest-serving mayor in Columbus' history. His final term in office ended on January 1, 2016, when he was succeeded by Andy Ginther.



Coleman was a close personal friend of William Adams who worked tirelessly on the mayor's behalf over the years.

The Mayor looked to Adams for advice and input on the needs of the community, selecting him for several government committees, including the City's Veterans Advisory Board and the Recreation and Parks Commission. Mayor Coleman gave the eulogy at Adams' funeral services in 2013 and lead the effort to rename the William H. Adams Community Center at Krumm Park in his honor.

The Village Elders designation is based upon the Nigerian proverb, "*It takes a whole village to raise a child*". Village Elders are donors who help sustain the work of the Foundation and others recognized for outstanding community service aligned with the Foundation's mission.
